Division L of the *America COMPETES Act* versus the U.S. Innovation and Competition Act:

Overview

The only provision in Division L of the America COMPETES Act, which features programs under the jurisdiction of the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, is Section 110001 to establish a new long-term economic development planning grant program. The provision is based on a bill (HR4651) first introduced by Rep. Derek Kilmer (D-WA), the Rebuilding Economies and Creating Opportunities for More People to Excel (RECOMPETE) Act. Although there is a Senate companion (S2464) introduced by Sens. Coons (D-DE), Bennet (D-CO), Klobuchar (D-MN) and Rosen (D-NV), it was not included in the Senate-passed U.S. Innovation and Competition Act (USICA).

Recompete Pilot Program	The COMPETES Act would authorize \$4 billion to create a new "Recompete Pilot Program" that would provide 10-year grants to local governments, tribal communities or their designated recipients to implement comprehensive economic development plans intended to alleviate persistent economic distress and spur lasting job creation.	No comparable provision.
	The pilot program would be administered by the Commerce Department's Economic Development Administration.	
	Eligible areas include local labor markets, including tribal lands, where the average prime-age employment rate is at least 2.5 percent higher than the national prime-age employment rate over the last five years and meets other criteria set by the Secretary.	
	Eligible entities include local governments, including tribal governments, and entities authorized by local governments to oversee this program.
